

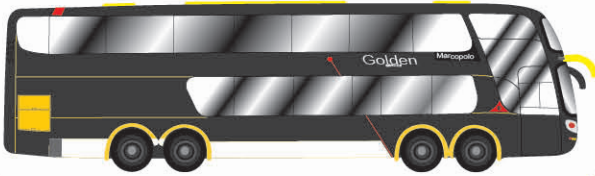

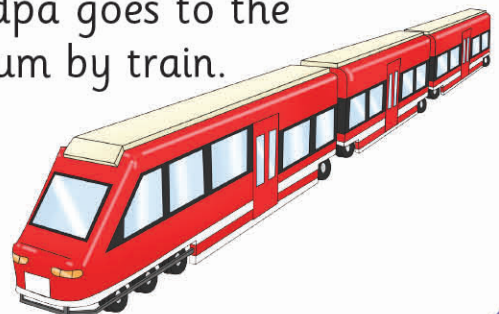

## Simple Present 1

A. The simple present is the most basic tense in the English language. We use the simple present to talk about facts, habits, routines or to say how often something happens. It can also be something a person often forgets or usually does not do. It is not important that the action is happening at the time of speaking.



**Examples:** The earth **goes** around the sun.

Sami **gets** up at six o'clock.

Ali **brushes** his teeth every day.

I **work** at the library at the weekends.

Waleed **cleans** his bedroom.

He **drinks** milk every day.

He **visits** his grandpa on Sundays.

She **jogs** four miles every day.

B. We use **do** and **does** to make questions and negatives.

<b>Do</b>	I/we/you/they	work? swim?
<b>Does</b>	he/she/it	drive?

I/We/You/They	<b>don't</b>	work. swim.
He/She/It	<b>doesn't</b>	drive.

C. We do not use **do** and **does** to make questions and negatives with verbs to be (**am, is, are**).

## Present Simple Spelling

Some present simple verbs have spelling changes with 'he', 'she' or 'it'.

add 's' for most verbs → works, eats, sleeps

add 'es' for words that end in 'ch', 's', 'sh', 'x' or 'z' → passes, rushes, watches

change 'y' to 'i' and add 'es' when the base form ends in a consonant + 'y' → studies, hurries, dries

but do not change the 'y' when the base form ends in a vowel, add 's' → plays, enjoys, boys

a few verbs have irregular forms → is, does, goes

## Michael Jordan Is My Hero

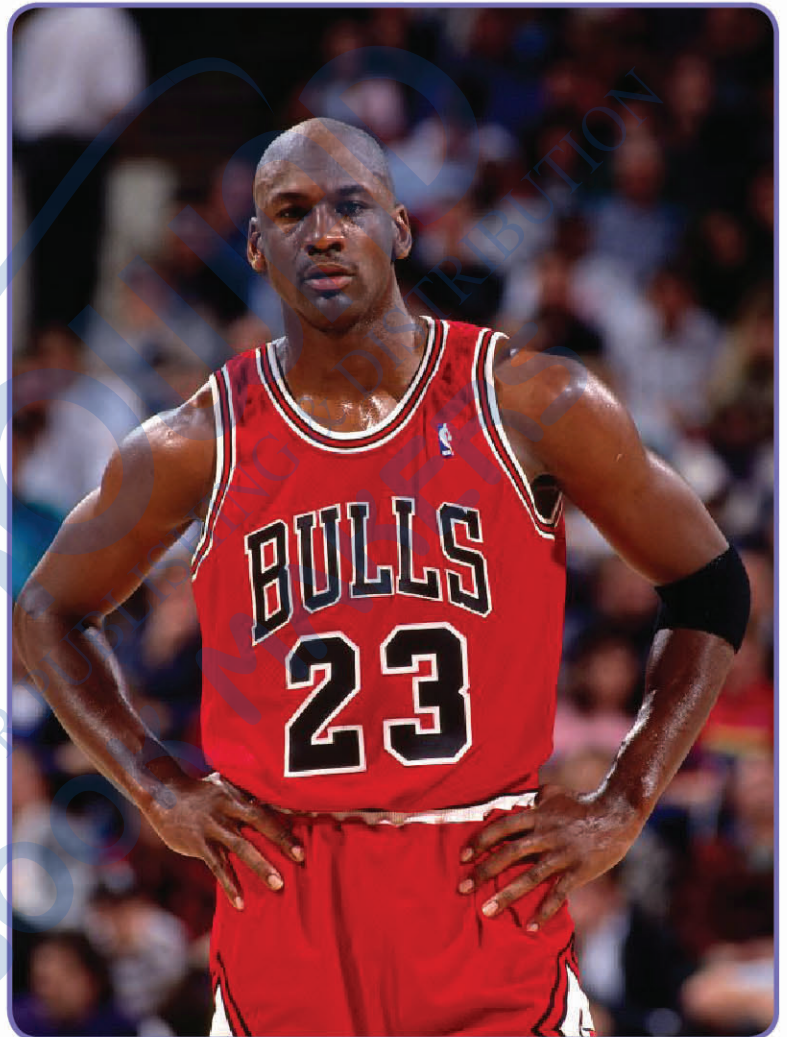
